They want to hang out on the street all day with their friends. Giovanni (37) has already spent 18 years in jail. He wants to change his life. Don Ciro is his parole officer. It is difficult for kids in this neighborhood to commit themselves to a proper career. Facing poverty as an alternative, the temptation is very great.
